SBISD School Partnership Meeting

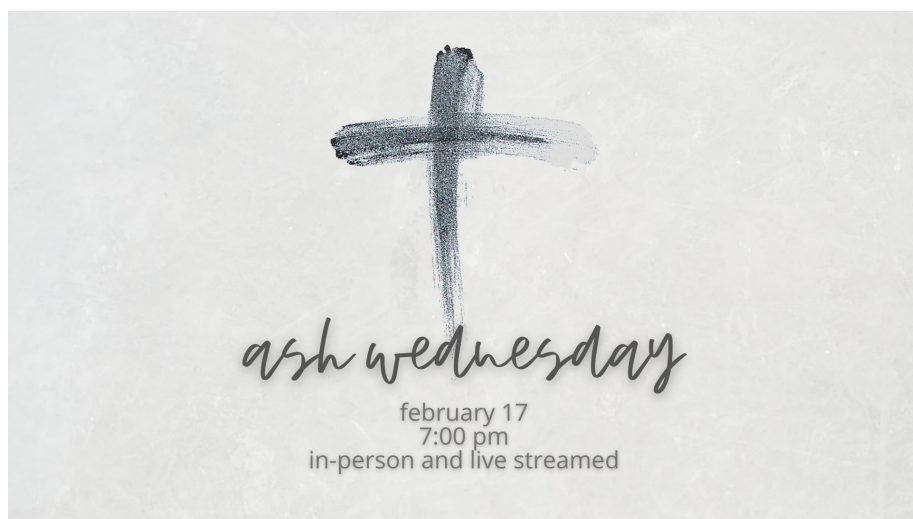
