LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE Week Three: Bethlehem Candle

Lighting the Advent wreath originated in Germany, based on a Roman custom of the ceremonial entrance of a ruler to a province or city as his 'advent' (from the Latin adventus, meaning 'arrival'). One candle is lit the first Sunday of Advent, two are lit the second Sunday, and so on. Each of the candles has special significance. The final candle, the Christ candle, is lit at Christmas.

Leader: The Advent wreath helps us remember the miracle of God's becoming man for our sake. The wreath is a circle, causing us to remember the eternity of God's love for us and for all humanity. It is decked with green boughs, causing us to remember the newness of life we have in Christ Jesus.

> The first candle reminds us of the prophets' hope for God's salvation to come. The second candle reminds us of Jesus' humility in coming to earth and being born in a stall.

- People: The third candle reminds us of the joy of the shepherds as they heard the good news of Jesus' arrival, for: "The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them."
- Leader: So let us stand and sing as we celebrate the coming of God into the world!
